## Before you begin

- 1. Save and close all open files and exit all open applications.
- 2. Shut down your computer.

The shut-down instruction varies depending on the operating system installed on your computer.

- Windows 10: Click Start > U Power > Shut down.
- Windows 8.1: On the Start screen, Click the power icon ♥ > Shut down.
- Windows 7: Click **Start** > **Shut down**.
- NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.
- 3. Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4. Disconnect all attached network devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, and monitor, from your computer.
- 5. Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- 6. Close the display and turn the computer over.

















# Flashing the BIOS

You may need to flash (update) the BIOS when an update is available or when you replace the system board. To flash the BIOS:

- 1. Turn on your computer.
- 2. Go to www.dell.com/support.
- 3. Click **Product support**, enter the Service Tag of your computer, and then click **Submit**.

# **Diagnostics**

#### Power and battery-status light/ hard-drive activity light

Indicates the battery-charge status or the hard-drive activity.

i) NOTE: Press Fn+H to toggle this light between power and battery-status light and hard-drive activity light.

#### Hard-drive activity light

Turns on when the computer reads from or writes to the hard drive.

#### Power and battery-status light

Indicates the power and battery-charge status.

Solid white - Power adapter is connected and the battery has more than 5 percent charge.

Amber - Computer is running on battery and the battery has less than 5 percent charge.

#### Off

- Power adapter is connected and the battery is fully charged.
- Computer is running on battery and the battery has more than 5 percent charge.
- Computer is in sleep state, hibernation, or turned off.

The power and battery-status light blinks amber along with beep codes indicating failures.

For example, the power and battery-status light blinks amber two times followed by a pause, and then blinks white three times followed by a pause. This 2,3 pattern continues until the computer is turned off indicating no memory or RAM is detected.

The following table shows the different power and battery-status light patterns and associated problems.

Light Pattern	Problem description
2,1	CPU failure
2,2	System board: BIOS and ROM failure
2,3	No memory or RAM detected
2,4	Memory or RAM failure
2,5	Invalid memory installed
2,6	System board or chipset error
2,7	LCD failure
3,1	CMOS battery failure
3,2	PCI or video card or chip failure
3,3	Recovery image not found
3,4	Recovery image found but invalid

The computer may emit a series of beeps during start-up if the errors or problems cannot be displayed. The repetitive beep codes help the user troubleshoot problems with the computer.

#### Camera status light-

Indicates whether the camera is in use.

- Solid white Camera is in use.
- Off Camera is not in use.

#### Caps Lock status light-

Indicates whether Caps Lock is enabled or disabled.

- Solid white Caps Lock enabled.
- Off Caps Lock disabled.
